Consolidating Japan's Administration in Malaya and Indonesia Research, Planning, Propaganda

Japan's occupation of Southeast Asia began on a triumphal note, and both Japanese officials and local populations had reason to believe that the New Order in the region would lead to the consolidation of Greater East Asia and would continue indefinitely. Military administrators had to deal with war damage, shortages of basic supplies, and revenue shortfalls, but with some assistance from the Japanese homeland, they were also charting a course for the region that deviated from its colonial past.

The presentations in this seminar will deal with this initial phase of the occupation, discussing administrative structures, Japanese research into local social and economic conditions, and how the Japanese presented themselves and the Greater East Asia concept through various propaganda initiatives.
